
# Camila Palma introduces the SPO

What have been the most substantial initiatives promoted by your Scientific Society to date?

Our main initiatives to promote oral health in children are focused on education, prevention, and advocacy. We are proud to say that the SPO has been able to conduct scientific Congresses since its creation in 1953, for 70 years straight! Even during the pandemic, the annual meeting was held online, with more than 700 participants from all over the world. These continuing education opportunities enable Pediatric Dentists to stay updated on the latest minimally invasive practices. Moreover, our Society publishes research related to pediatric dentistry in our journal, providing evidence-based guidelines for practitioners. The SPO also advocates for preventive care programmes and children's oral health through community dental screenings.

## Brief history of the Scientific Society

The Peruvian Society of Pediatric Dentistry (SPO) was founded in Lima in 1953, so we celebrated its 70th anniversary this year. It is the main pediatric dentistry organization in Peru and is based in Lima. Its board is comprised of 12 members elected for a period of two years (President, Past President, Vice-president, Secretary, Past Secretary, Treasurer, Past-treasurer, Director of Scientific affairs, 2 Arbiters, Library Director and Regional coordinator). The Peruvian society has representatives in 11 Peruvian regions. The SPO is an active member of the International Association of Pediatric Dentistry (IAPD) and the Latin American Association of Pediatric Dentistry (ALOP). Our aim is to support the scientific progress in Pediatric Dentistry and highlight the importance of our specialty in

#### LAST DMFT INDEX MEASURED IN THE POPULATION

Last epidemiological national study found a caries prevalence of 76% in 3-5 year-old children and the average DMFT at this age range was 5, with the decayed component contributing 4.5 to this score. In children younger than 12 years old, caries prevalence is 85%. Dental caries in Peru is the most prevalent disease in school and preschool children and the main reason for external visits in primary healthcare centers.

## What is the level of collaboration between dentists and paediatricians?

Collaboration between Pediatric Dentists and Paediatricians is essential to promote early dental visits and to advocate for children's oral health. The SPO has created an Oral Health Guideline Manual for Paediatricians, and we hope that future collaborations between both societies will enable the creation of policy statements, as well as specific trainings in both fields. We wish to accomplish these objectives in the near future.

### What would be necessary to improve children's oral health?

Peru is amongst the countries with the highest prevalence of untreated Early Childhood Caries in the region. An urgent change of direction is needed. This paradigm shift requires a multifaceted approach involving various stakeholders, including healthcare professionals, policymakers, parents, caregivers, scientific societies, and community organizations. From a political standpoint, it is crucial to integrate strategies to prevent ECC into public health programmes during the first year of life (including a healthy diet, regular use of fluoridated toothpaste, and early dental visits). Moreover, it is essential that Pediatric Dentists, led by the SPO, keep advocating for ECC prevention and for the importance of primary teeth to parents, caregivers, and the community at large.

#### What are the association's future projects?

We hope to keep leading the scientific agenda in Children's Oral Health in Peru through our Congresses and lectures, as well as integrating new Pediatric Dentists in our society. In the near future, we expect to collaborate closely with the Peruvian Academy of Pediatricians, as well as to raise awareness of the importance of oral health starting in early childhood through social media campaigns, educational materials, and programmes for parents, caregivers, and educators.
